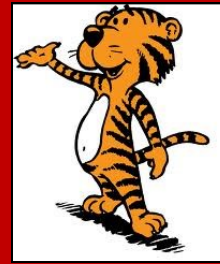


Chelsea Intermediate School August/September 2016

Transportation

Buses: In order to provide safe transportation for all of our students, **students must ride the same bus to and from school each day.** Students are required to use their designated bus stop for boarding and drop off each day. Please have your children to their assigned bus stop 5 minutes before their scheduled pickup time.

If you are going out of town and your child will be staying with a friend or relative, we ask that you make alternate transportation arrangements as we are unable to change a bus route for this reason.

Walkers and Car Riders: arrival time is at 8:50 each morning. Our primary concern is the safety of your child and that supervisors are available beginning at this time.

A.M. and P.M. drop off and pick up is located in the South Parking Lot which serves as the main office entrance. Parent cars are not allowed to use the circle drive off of 80th Avenue (bus loading area) nor the North Parking lot off of Sauk Trail (no student or visitor entrance).

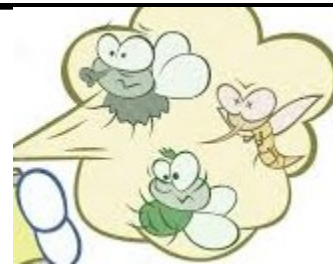
All students must be in their classroom when the bell rings at 9:05. Please allow sufficient time in the morning for your child to get to class. When arriving at or after 9:05, a tardy will be recorded.

Please do not attempt to pass a school bus from either direction when it has its lights flashing and its stop arm extended.



INTEGRATED PEST MANAGEMENT NOTICE

Frankfort School District #157-C complies with the Illinois Structural Pest Control Act, the Illinois Pesticide Act, the Illinois Lawn Care Products Application and Notification Act, and the Pesticide Application at Schools Act through the active involvement in an Integrated Pest Management Program and an Outdoor Spraying and Fertilizer Application Program. As part of this program, the District relies to the greatest extent possible on non-toxic, biological, cultural and mechanical pest management practices as well as the use of natural pest control agents. Chemical and airborne pesticides will be used only when necessary, and as a last resort, with a preference given for products that are the least harmful to human health and the environment. This practice applies to indoor and outdoor pesticide, fertilizer, turf management or other similar applications or sprayings. Such chemical and airborne applications will, if at all possible, be made only after normal business hours or on weekends to minimize the exposure to any individuals who normally access our buildings. As part of these programs, any individual(s) wishing to be placed on a notification list for indoor sprayings, outdoor sprayings, or both, can contact the Frankfort School District Business Office at 815-469-5922, ask for Sandy Pechtold, and let her know you would like to be put on the IPM and/or Outdoor Spraying Notification list for airborne spraying. By providing your name, address, phone number, and the school district buildings and/or sites you would like to be notified about, the Maintenance Department will attempt to contact you 96 hours in advance whenever possible, and no less than 48 hours in advance when necessary, of any scheduled airborne or chemical applications being undertaken inside or outside our buildings, or as soon as possible in the event any emergency spraying applications are needed. Student Insurance:

We are again offering student insurance through Markel Insurance Company. This insurance is offered as an additional/supplemental benefit for our families, but is not required by the School District or associated with the District's Insurance Program. (It is separate, optional coverage for students). TURN CELL PHONES OFF

Reminder Regarding Prohibited Cell Phone Use in School Zones:

Per Public Act 096-0131, the use of hand held cell phones or other similar electronic devices (except if used in "hands free" mode) when operating a motor vehicle in a school zone are prohibited (except for certain emergencies and situations specifically delineated in the law). In general, you are not allowed to talk, text or surf the web with a cell phone or hand held electronic device while operating a motor vehicle in a school zone (unless the device is in hands free mode). If your car is in park then you are allowed to use such devices, but if the vehicle is engaged (even if it is stopped at the time) then you should not be using your cell phone or hand held electronic device. In order to minimize distracted driving and ensure the safety of our students, staff, parents and community members who may be in our school zones (either on the roadways or on school property), we are asking everyone to please follow these guidelines and adhere to the law. We had a few close calls last year and are asking everyone for their cooperation and support to ensure that a tragedy doesn't occur. We are asking the Frankfort Police to assist us in enforcing this regulation, and after an initial education/warning period at the beginning of the school year, the Police Department and/or the School District reserve the right to issue citations to offenders. Again, we are asking for your cooperation and don't anticipate issuing any citations, but we will do so if necessary. We are posting reminders of this law on the school zone signs throughout the school district and will also be handing out reminder pamphlets the first few weeks of school to those in the car rider pickup lines. New Students A student ID number is necessary for all RevTrak purchases. Please select "contact us" on the RevTrak link if you do not have your student's ID number.

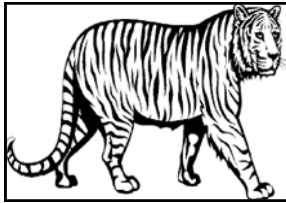
Sending Notes to the School



If you are changing your child's mode of transportation for the day, **please send a note** with your child in the morning. The teacher will be aware of the change and forward the communication to the office. Changes can only occur with written notification from the parent/guardian. Please contact the office with any questions or in emergency situations.

Email communication to teachers is convenient, however be aware that occasionally emails are not received by the intended recipient. A staff member may be absent, or the office does not receive a copy of your message. When communicating with the school regarding planned absences, early leaves, transportation changes, or after school activity issues, **written notes are the most reliable.**

When sending notes, please use a full sheet of paper. Include the teacher's name, the child's full name, the date and include a full, legible parent signature. This information is important to us when notes are forwarded to the office.

You Have Earned a Stripe!

Students and staff are participating in an incentive program called Earn Your Stripes. Note from the Nurse with Mrs. Busch



When is my child sick enough to stay home from school?

We realize that this is not always an easy question. We hope these tips help!

Our school practice states that you should not send your child to school if they have:

1. Fever in the past 24 hours
2. Vomiting in the past 24 hours.
3. Diarrhea in the past 24 hours.
4. Sore throat-especially with a fever or swollen glands
5. Strep Throat-They must have been taking an antibiotic for at least 24 hours before returning to school.
6. Bad cold- with a very runny nose or bad cough, especially if it has kept the child awake at night.
7. Head Lice-until your child has been treated according to the nurse or doctor's instructions.
8. Rash-will be assumed to be contagious and needs to be diagnosed by a doctor with a note accompanying them on their return.
9. Pink Eye-will need to be seen by a physician and on antibiotics for 24 hours before returning to school.
10. Appearance, Behavior-unusually tired, pale, lack of appetite, difficult to wake, confused or irritable. This is sufficient reason to stay home.

IF YOUR CHILD SHOWS ANY OF THE ABOVE SYMPTOMS AT SCHOOL, THEY WILL BE SENT HOME.

Bringing a sick child to school puts many other children and staff at risk of getting sick. Please reinforce the healthy practice of good hand washing, covering your mouth with your elbow when you cough or sneeze, and keeping hands away from their face.
